Bio: Miguel Benito graduated from European University of Madrid in 2003 and completed his MSc in Health Research at Universidad Complutense de Madrid in 2012. He has worked in the neurorehabilitation field since 2003 in both Madrid and Toronto.

Since 2008 he has been an associated professor at the University of Salamanca in Madrid, in the Faculty of Physiotherapy, teaching Neurological Physiotherapy to undergraduate students. He became an IBITA recognized Basic Instructor in 2013 and Advanced in 2021. Currently, Miguel is co-founder of the Centre of Terapia.

Julie emigrated to Toronto in 1991, initially taking a position at Lyndhurst, Spinal Cord Injury Centre, and then later opening her own private community neurorehabilitation practice, Physio-Logic, in Toronto in 1993. Julie completed her MSc in Neurological Rehabilitation at Leeds Metropolitan University, UK in 2010, and her doctoral studies at the Rehabilitation Sciences Institute, University of Toronto in 2016. Julie has had a number of post-doctoral positions and she holds an Assistant Clinical Professor (Adjunct) position in the School of



Rehabilitation Science at McMaster University and, an Adjunct Lecturer appointment in the Department of Physical Therapy at the University of Toronto. Julie recently founded iNeuroRehab, an e-learning platform for clinicians.
